IPA Section Kenya is pleased to invite you to the 2025 International Investigations Seminar on Strengthening Professional Policing and Crime Management in a Changing World that will be in Nairobi, the capital of Kenya, from November 2nd (arrival) to November 7th (departure).

The accommodation is provided by the National Criminal Investigations Academy (NCIA), located about 14 km from the port of arrival, the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA).

The course participants will be picked up from the airport. The journey takes around 10 minutes to reach NCIA.

The participation fee is KES 75,000 (600 euros) per participant and covers accommodation (single room), training, excursions, park fee charges, evening shopping visits to the major malls and meals during the mentioned period.

Each participant will receive IPA promotional materials and other necessary items for the seminar. The participants need to be in good physical and medical condition.

The topic of the Investigations Seminar is law. It will be delivered in English, and, therefore, the participants must have a good knowledge of English.

Also, the participants should be active police officers and/or IPA members working for corporations and wish to advance their investigative skills.

Attached, you will find the seminar registration form, and we encourage early registration to avoid disappointment. The registration will close on **September** 30 or earlier if demand is met.

CONCEPT NOTE

Introduction

The International Police Association (IPA) is an independent body made up of members of the police service belonging to national sections, whether on active duty or retired, without distinction as to rank, sex, race, colour, language, or religion.

Its main purpose is to create bonds of friendship and to promote international cooperation among its members with the broader public.

It is committed to the principles set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights as adopted by the United Nations in 1948 and recognises that any form of torture is absolutely inconsistent with these principles.

Its aims include the development of cultural relations among its members, a broadening of their general knowledge, and an exchange of professional experience; in addition, it seeks to foster mutual help in the social sphere and to contribute, within the limits of its possibilities, to peaceful coexistence between peoples and to the preservation of world peace.

Police Investigations Seminar Background:

In the realm of law enforcement, professional and ethical criminal investigations stand as the backbone of justice. Behind every solved case lies the dedication, skill, and training of those who work tirelessly to unravel the mysteries of crime.

Knowledge of police investigations is crucial in law enforcement, as it underpins the ability to solve crimes, ensure justice, and maintain public safety, requiring officers to understand investigative techniques, legal procedures, and criminal behaviour.

It is on this basis that the International Police Association, Section Kenya, brings together international and local investigators from the police and corporate sectors and other security stakeholders from Kenya and other regions of the world to share, learn, and discover ways to recognise, process, and preserve physical evidence that will yield reliable information to aid in the investigations.

Seminar Objectives

This International Police Association Section Kenya Police Investigations Seminar will bring together security partners and stakeholders of every cadre or calibre to discuss and understand the occurrence of incidents, to uncover the facts, to determine individual accountability, and to ensure fair outcomes in all matters under investigation.

Other objectives include:

- Promoting institutional and organisational capacity as police officers in identifying, planning, and implementing ethical, accountable, and effective investigations.
- Identifying opportunities as well as challenges in promoting professional investigations awareness within our workstations as police officers, corporate security heads, and other security stakeholders.
- Understanding changes in contexts that challenge investigation tools that we already have during our course of work.
- Exploring and exchanging workable investigation techniques to improve workplace morale and improve productivity.
- Building and strengthening capacity in understanding approaches and tools for implementing professional investigations, strategies and programmes at organisational and station level.
- Providing a platform for networking, meeting face-to-face, and exchanging investigation
 management practices between International Police Association members, security
 professionals, stakeholders, and practitioners from different IPA regions, organisations, and
 institutions.

Seminar Description

The Professional Committee, responsible for managing training activities on behalf of the National Executive Board (NEB), oversees the proposal. This arrangement sits well with the NEB-identified strategic pillars that represent the priorities for the IPA Kenya over the next four years.

The fact that criminal activities today transcend borders and manifest internationally drives the choice of investigation. The traditional "thug" or "bank robber", for example, has been rapidly phased out by tech-savvy criminals who attain their targets from the comfort of their phones or computer keyboards. The proposed international seminar, which will attract a global audience, will serve as an excellent platform for exchanging ideas and strategies aimed at enhancing law enforcement.

This seminar will take six full days (five nights), beginning Sunday evening, 2nd November at 1700 hrs, to Friday morning, 7th November 2025, at 0800 hrs in Nairobi, Kenya. International IPA speakers and participants in this seminar will discuss topical issues surrounding professional investigations and the effects of their outcomes on society and the economy, both in the public and private sectors, locally and internationally.

A wide range of topics, ranging from basic understanding investigations of road traffic accidents, child trafficking, forensic investigations, cybercrime investigations, and homicide, will be covered. Speakers, along with participants, will thoroughly explore methods to build and strengthen capacity in understanding approaches and tools for implementing investigations, strategies, and programmes at both organisational and station levels.

Speakers will also update participants on the latest advancements and practical challenges in the field of investigations.

Seminar Agenda

The five-day summit will begin with a brief overview of the theory and philosophy of the subject matter, followed by a deeper dive into core modules in comprehensive and interactive how-and-when sessions in the following areas:

- Understanding Investigations; Kenyan Context: The National Police Service
- Gain an understanding of the modern-day investigative approaches related to road traffic accidents, child trafficking, forensic investigations, cybercrime investigations, and homicide investigations.

- Visit to the National Forensics Laboratory.
- Case Studies: ONE BY ONE, studying, examining, and relating typical cases around the country and situations on the ground. Evaluating and forging lessons from them to apply back to workstations.

Target Audience

The International Investigations Seminar is intended for officers of the International Police Association members worldwide, police officers from the National Police Service, and investigators from both the public and private sectors, including corporations and state corporations/departments. -

- · Corporate Security Investigators
- · State corporation heads of investigations
- · Members of County and Sub-County Security Investigations
- · And any other individuals charged with the responsibility of investigations in public institutions.

Expected Outcome

It is expected that by the end of the workshop, the participants will have acquired new skills that will enable them to undertake ethical, accountable, and professional investigations that ensure justice for the victims while upholding fundamental human rights for both the victims and the accused.

The seminar organisers will share the contents of the discussions and presentations to create a working document or publication that may be used across countries and institutions to professionalise investigations.
